Internal parasites are one of the biggest health problems affecting goats and sheep in the Northeast. Join Dr. Tatiana Stanton and Jan Liotta from Cornell University Department of Animal Science to learn about how to evaluate and manage parasites within your small ruminant flock.

- The basics of parasite control
- How to develop integrated parasite management programs
- Hands-on training on how to use the FAMACHA© Anemia Card (good only for the barber pole worm) as part of a 5-point check to determine which animals in your herd or flock most likely need deworming.
- Hands-on fecal egg count training
- We will also go over the current status of several alternative methods of parasite control.
