<u>REMINDER:</u> National Wheat Yield Contest Deadline May 15!!!

I know everyone has corn and soybean planting on their minds but I wanted to remind those wanting to enter the wheat contest that the deadline is right around the corner. Just a reminder that the entry process is totally on-line (no paper copies) and is identical to the national corn contest. To enter you must be a member of the National Association of Wheat Growers (NAWG) which is \$100/year. The contest entry fee is \$125. It would be great to get NY on the map and let everyone know we grow some high yielding wheat!

- Here is a summary of some of the contest rules:
- Must be certified seed, a blended seed can be used
- Entry field must be at least five continuous acres
- The harvest entry must be at least 1.5 acres
- Must have a designated supervisor
- Must be weighed on a certified scale, no weigh wagons
- Reweigh required if over 150 bu/acre
- Quality sample required

National and State winners are established based on the percentage your final yield is above the 5-year Olympic average for your county. For example, if your county average is 50 bushel and your contest yield is 100 bushel, then you are 100% above your county average. I looked up what the 5-year Olympic average (2012 – 2016) for wheat is for our ten counties. The Olympic average means you throw out the highest and lowest of the five years.
