### Soybean Aphid Scouting information from Mike Stanyard, NWNYDLFC

From their most recent Crop Alert: The last three growing seasons have not been big soybean aphid years, which has been great! However, I saw the winged forms flying off buckthorn three weeks ago. We are hoping that plants treated with Cruiser will take care of those first aphids. However, I have two reports (Erie and Niagara County) from consultants that they have found some plants already over the threshold of 250 aphids per plant.

### Dairy Market Watch Now Available – June 2021

June has brought some fluid milk distribution hurdles due to driver shortages and extreme heat. Dairy exports are helping to prop up dairy prices and positions the US positively as world demand is outpacing world production. Moving parts of domestic milk production, sales, exports – will affect the milk price for the second half of 2021.
