June Brings Pest Damage and Dry Conditions

Pheromone Trap Data



Although the pheromone traps have low BCW activity, some fields are experiencing 10% feeding damage. Scout your corn fields now to check for damage like missing, cut, and wilted plants.



Abnormally Dry Conditions in SWNY

Most of the Southwest region has entered (DO) abnormally dry conditions represented by the yellow, which can cause stunted growth. Check for rolling corn leaves, leaf flipping in soybeans, and reduced second-cutting yields.

Growing Degree Days (GDD) is calculated by taking the average daily temperature and subtracting it from the base temperature of a specified plant ((High + Low)/2 - base temp = GDD). For corn, we use base 86/50, meaning that corn development starts at 50°F and stops at 86°F. Send your planting date to see how many GDDs you accumulate!
