### **Grain Bin and Safety Rescue Training**

The Chautauqua County Office of Emergency Services and Chautauqua County Farm Bureau have recently been selected to receive specialized rescue training and equipment needed to respond to a grain entrapment incident in Chautauqua County and nearby areas. The new equipment will be awarded and demonstrated at a safety and rescue program being held August 22nd.
